CRAFTS COLLEGE?) until 1955. Active in Moscow. Head of Tretyakov Gallery 1980-92. Became a Soviet academician. Best known as a monumentalist. Made paintings with B. A. Talberg (q.v.) 1950s. Died 1992.

KOROLKOV, Vyacheslav Georgievich. Born 1952. Active in Erevan, Armenia.

KOROPCHAK, Stepan Grigorevich. Born in Ugertsy (today in Lvov region, Ukraine) 1926. Studied at the Lvov Institute of Applied and Decorative Art until 1953. Active in Lvov. Also a graphic artist.

KOROSTELEV, Petr Gurevich. Born 1924. Active in Leningrad. *Plate 130.*

KOROSTELEV (KOROSTYLEV), Vladimir Aleksandrovich. Born 1925. Active in Zaporozhe, Ukraine: Sumy, Ukraine.

KOROSTIN, Andrei Ilich. Born 1855. Studied at Imperial ACADEMY OF ARTS 1882-87. Died 1912.

KOROSTYLEV, V. A. - see **KOROSTELEV, V. A.**

KOROTAEV, German Petrovich. Born 1940. Active in Dzerzhinski, Moscow reg.

KOROTIN, Viktor Evgenevich. Born 1940. Active in Khabarovsk. Died 1980s.

KOROTKOV, Albert Anatolevich. Born 1938. Active in Tula.

KOROTKOV, Andrei Vasilevich. Born in Kharkov province (Ukraine) 1902. Studied at the Kharkov Art Institute until 1930. Active in Kiev, Ukraine. Also a graphic artist.

KOROTKOV, Nikolai Aleksandrovich. Born in Nikolskoe, Yaroslavl reg., 1931. Studied at Yaroslavl Art College 1946-51; REPIN INSTITUTE 1959-65. Active in Kostroma. Specialised in landscapes. Taught at Kostroma Teacher-Training Institute from 1965. Also a writer on art teaching and architecture.

KOROTKOV, Valentin Dmitrievich. Born 1936(38?). Studied at Penza Art College 1953-58; SURIKOV INSTITUTE 1958-64. Active in Krasnoyarsk. Began exhibiting 1972.

KOROTKOV, Vasili Ivanovich. Exhibited with ITINERANTS 1916 (ex. 44).

KOROTKOVA, Maiya Andreevna. Born 1925. Active in Moscow.

KOROTKOVA, Nina Fedorovna. Born in Tashkent (Uzbekistan) 1901(04?). Studied at Turkestan Regional Art School, Tashkent, 1919-20; *RABFAK* of Moscow *VKHUTEMAS* 1922-24; Moscow *VKHUTEMAS/VKHUTEIN* 1924-30. Active in Tashkent; Moscow from 1921. Member of

OMAKHR. AKHR, RAPKH. Important shows include 'ANTI-IMPERIALIST EXHIBITION', Moscow, 1931; 'Fifteen Years of the Workers' and Peasants' Red Army', Moscow, 1933; 'Twenty Years of the Workers' and Peasants' Red Army', Moscow, 1938; 'INDUSTRY OF SOCIALISM', Moscow, 1939. Married to I. A. Lukomski (q.v.).

KOROTKOVA, Paulina Iosifovna. Born 1902. Active in Leningrad. Died 1980s.

KOROVAL, Aleksandr Nikolaevich. Born 1928. Active in Ivano-Frankovsk, Ukraine.

KOROVAL, Elena Lyudvigovna. Born in Voronezh 1900/01? Studied at the Drawing School of the OPKH 1913(15?)-16/18? Active in Barnaul late 1910s-at least 1920; in Siberia 1921-23; in Simferopol, Crimea, 1923-24; in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, c. 1924-30; in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, 1930-46(37/47?); in Moscow thereafter. Member of MASTERS OF THE NEW EAST from 1927. Important shows include 'All-Union Art Exhibition', Moscow, 1946. Taught in own studio, Barnaul, until at least 1920. Married to M. I. Kurzin (q.v.) (partnership broke up 1930). Died in Moscow 1974.

KOROVCHINSKI, Viktor Musievich. Born in Batsmany (Sumy reg., Ukraine) 1890. Studied at Kiev Art College 1910-13; Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE 1914-18. Active in Romny, Poltava pr., Ukraine, 1918-30:

Moscow thereafter. Member of *AKHCHU* 1923-29. Died in Moscow 1949.

KOROVIN, Aleksei Konstantinovich. Born in Moscow 1896/97? Active in Moscow until 1923, when emigrated to Paris. Member of WORLD OF ART from 1918. Exhibited with WORLD OF ART 1921. Specialised in landscapes. Also a theatre artist. Son of K. A. Korovin (q.v.). Died in Paris 1950.

KOROVIN, Anatoli Yakovlevich. Born 1930. Studied at Penza Art College until 1956. Active on 'Michurin' collective farm, Penza reg.

KOROVIN, Andrei Ivanovich. Born 1883. Active in Tbilisi, Georgia. Died in period 1958-67.

KOROVIN, Konstantin Alekseevich. Born in Moscow 1861. Studied at the Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE from 1875-86(83?); at the Imperial ACADEMY OF ARTS 1882. Active in Moscow until 1923, when emigrated to Paris. Began exhibiting 1880s. Member of the UNION OF RUSSIAN ARTISTS from 1903; of the WORLD OF ART. Exhibited with the ITINERANTS 1889-99 (ex's 17, 19, 21-27); with *MOLKH* 1889-1911; with the MTKH 1894-99; with the WORLD OF ART 1899-1922; with the 36 ARTISTS; with the UNION OF RUSSIAN ARTISTS 1903-22. Taught at the STROGANOV COLLEGE and the Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE 1901-18; at the Moscow FREE ART STUDIOS 1918-19; at the RUSSIAN ACADEMY, Paris, c. 1930. Became an academician 1905. Also a monumentalist, theatre artist. Leading exponent of Impressionism. Member of ABRAMTSEVO CIRCLE from 1885; brother of S. A. Korovin (q.v.). Died in Paris 1939.

KOROVIN, Niktopolion (Niktopolian) Aleksandrovich. Active in Moscow mid-1920s. Exhibited with ITINERANTS 1923 (ex. 48).

KOROVIN, Oleg Dmitrievich. Born 1915. Studied at Perm Art College until 1936. Active in Sverdlovsk until 1953; Moscow thereafter. Important shows include 'All-Union Art Exhibition', Moscow, 1951; 'All-Union Art Exhibition', Moscow, 1952; 'All-Union Art Exhibition', Moscow, 1955. Also a graphic artist.

KOROVIN, Petr Ivanovich. Born 1857. Studied at Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE 1880s. Member of MTKH from 1890s. Exhibited with ITINERANTS 1889-92 (ex's 17-20). Specialised in genre pictures. Died 1919.

KOROVIN, Sergei Alekseevich. Born in Moscow 1858. Studied at the Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE 1876(75?)-86. Active in Moscow. Member of the UNION OF RUSSIAN ARTISTS from 1903 (founder member); of *MOLKH*. Exhibited with the ITINERANTS 1885, 1891, 1893 (ex's 13, 19, 21); with the MTKH 1895; with the 36 ARTISTS; with the WORLD OF ART 1902, 1903; with the UNION OF RUSSIAN ARTISTS 1903, 1906, 1908. Well-known works include *At the Village Assembly* (1892; Tretyakov Gallery). Taught at the Moscow COLLEGE OF PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND ARCHITECTURE 1888-94, 1898-1907/08? Also a graphic artist. Leading painter of social realist subjects. Brother of K. A. Korovin (q.v.). Died in Moscow 1908.

KOROVIN, Viktor Ivanovich. Born in Leningrad 1936. Studied at the Leningrad Art College until 1960. Active in Leningrad. Began exhibiting no later than 1960.

KOROVIN, Yuvnali Dmitrievich. Born in Ekaterinburg 1913. Studied at the Moscow ART INSTITUTE until 1938. Active in Moscow. Began exhibiting 1939. Important shows include 'All-Union Art Exhibition', Moscow, 1955. Best known as a graphic artist.
